

Dilation

Dilation is a diagnostic procedure to evaluate the back of the eyes by dilating (opening) the pupils. The doctor highly recommends dilation as part of the comprehensive eye exam to provide the highest level of eye care for all patients. Dilation is best combined with digital retinal photography to thoroughly evaluate and permanently record the eye health. Dilation is also recommended in children whose cooperation is limited during the eye exam.

The dilation procedure consists of using eye drops to open the pupils; side effects for most patients are light sensitivity and blurred vision (especially at near), and usually lasts about 4-6 hours. We highly recommend that you have someone drive for you when you have your eyes dilated. If you experience any of the symptoms after dilation, seek immediate medical attention: redness, painful eyes, blurry or steamy vision, nausea, or headache.
